Living in Kona is not something we realized we would be doing. Hawaii??? Why would a missionary go there? Isn't that just a place for vacations?

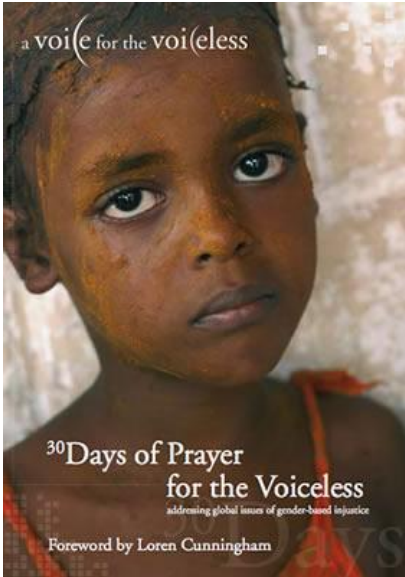
